Our school choir recently attended the annual Young Voices event in Manchester and, as usual, had a wonderful time! There were some tired children the following day!



Please could we remind parents and carers that if you receive benefits you can apply for Free School Meals. We would especially ask those who have children between the ages of 4 and 7 to apply as our school will then get extra money to help your child in class. If you do not apply for the benefit then our school loses funding. Even though our young children actually get a free meal from the government you should still apply as school will get extra money to support learning. Holocaust Memorial Day 2018

Years 5 and 6 were very honoured and humbled by the visit of Mr Leonard Kauffman, who escaped the Holocaust on the Kinder transport.

Mr Kauffmann, who lost his entire family in the ghettos and extermination camps, came over to England as a four year old child refugee. He movingly described how he had left his parents whom he never saw again and came over to be cared for by strangers. We focussed on the journey of that small boy rather than the horrors of the camps. Our staff and children were very moved indeed.
