<b>Monday</b>	<p>This week we are going to focus on <u>fractions</u>.</p> <p>Today, were going to think about halving shapes!</p> <p>We don't want you to do any written work today, instead, everything that you eat we'd like you to split in half first!</p> <p>For example,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- If you're having toast for breakfast - use a knife to cut it in half before you eat it!</li><li>- If you're having a bag of crisps as a snack - share them into two bowls first - haw many in each half?</li></ul> <p><u>Challenge:</u> can you tell your grown up the definition of a half?</p>	<p><u>Non Fiction Writing</u></p> <p>What is a fact?</p> <p><u>Two truths and a fib</u></p> <p>Can you tell someone two real things about yourself and then make something up.</p> <p>Can they guess which was the fib?</p> <p><u>Can you list some facts about a family member of your favourite toy?</u></p>
<b>Tuesday</b>	<p>Go on a simple shape hunt around your house today, can you find at least 5 different shapes?</p> <p>Draw these carefully on a piece of paper and then fold them in half! You might need a ruler to help you.</p> <p><u>Challenge:</u> did you manage to fold every shape that you found in half? If not, why do you think this is?</p>	<p><u>Research</u></p> <p><u>VE Day</u></p> <p>Did you celebrate this?</p> <p>What did you do?</p>  A circular logo for VE Day. **Find a Half (2)**

Use counters to help you.

True or false? We have 10 gems.  
If we halve them, I get 7 and you get 3.



I have 8 gold coins.

<b>Thursday</b>	<p><u>Half of a number</u></p> <p>Set a timer for 1 minute. Your grown up is going to ask you as many 'halving questions' as they can in 1 minute</p> <p>For example</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- What is half of 10?</li></ul> <p>Try this again 2 more times during the day - can you answer more questions within your minute as the day goes on?</p> <p><u>Challenge:</u> role reversal - you ask your grown up the questions and see how many they can answer. Make sure they don't cheat!!!!</p>	<p>Talk to a grown up who has celebrated something similar when they were young. Can you compare what they did to what you have done?</p>
<b>Friday</b>	<p>Have a look on the internet and find out how to make a paper aeroplane. Paper aeroplanes use lots of precise folds, most of which are shapes being folded in half.</p> <p>Ask everyone in your household to make a paper aeroplane and have a paper aeroplane flying contest. Whose paper aeroplane wins?!</p>	<p><u>Sound hunt!</u></p> <p>Find as many objects as you can inside your house or in the garden which contain the ay/ai/a_e/ phoneme (sound). Look inside and outside. Write labels for the objects you have found.</p> <p><u>Challenge:</u> Can you write these words in sentences? <b>Example:</b> The crayon said can you make a cake.</p>
