

Thursday	 <u>Half of a number</u> Set a timer for 1 minute. Your grown up is going to ask you as many 'halving questions' as they can in 1 minute For example What is half of 10? Try this again 2 more times during the day - can you answer more questions within your minute as the day goes on? <u>Challenge:</u> role reversal - you ask your grown up the questions and see how many they can answer. Make sure they don't cheat!!!! 	Talk to a grown up who has celebrated something similar when they were young. Can you compare what they did to what you have done?
Friday	Have a look on the internet and find out how to make a paper aeroplane. Paper aeroplanes use lots of precise folds, most of which are shapes being folded in half. Ask everyone in your household to make a paper aeroplane and have a paper aeroplane flying contest. Whose paper aeroplane wins?!	<u>Sound hunt!</u> Find as many objects as you can inside your house or in the garden which contain the ay/ai/a_e/ phoneme (sound). Look inside and outside. Write labels for the objects you have found. <u>Challenge:</u> Can you write these words in sentences? Example: The crayon said can you make a cake.
