Here are some suggested activities that we would usually cover in Year 5 during the Summer Term. We've tried to choose 'stand alone' activities so that you can pick and choose a selection to complete each week, if you wish to do so. You may

prefer to choose a particular subject of interest e.g. History to focus on throughout the week, or to develop your own ideas and activities.

RE		Festivals	Purim (Jewish festival) – Part 2 Re-enact elements of the Purim festival. Choose an activity to do at home:  * Re-enact the story making lots of noise when Haman's name is said (you will need to be very rowdy). Use instruments and props to bring the story alive.  * Make crowns to wear for the story re-enactment.  * Make your own hamantashen pastries using the recipe from: <a href="http://allrecipes.co.uk/recipe/1403/hamantaschen.aspx">http://allrecipes.co.uk/recipe/1403/hamantaschen.aspx</a> These are easy to make and are eaten during this festival.  * Give away 'Purim' baskets – you could make up a little parcel of food / baking / crafts to give to family or friends.  * Listen to Jewish music which would be played at parties: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rnp0zchS9Lg">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rnp0zchS9Lg</a> If time, write a short recount of your 'Purim Party' re-enactment. Science		Life Cycles	Summary of Learning What have you learnt from this topic? Create a mind map or poster to show your learning. Here are the main areas we have covered: Stages of a plant's life cycle Germination Pollination Seed dispersal Parts of flowers

DT		'Marbulous' Structures	Testing and Evaluating Test your marble run. Can you film your marble run in action? Answer the following questions: Which aspects of your run are you pleased with? What problems did you encounter? How did you overcome your problems? What would you do differently if you were to make another marble run? What have you learned in this unit of work?

Computing	Coding	Over the last half term we have worked on a number of 'unplugged' ICT activities and games designed to develop your coding skills even if you haven't got access to a computer. This week's activity is to develop your own unplugged activity to revise the concepts of: algorithms, sequence, de-bugging and abstract thinking. Try it out on a family member and use if possible record /film what you've done. We'd love to see your ideas!
