Geography

Jamaica is a large mountainous island in the Caribbean. Over half a million Jamaicans live in Kingston, the capital, founded after an earthquake destroyed much of the original capital, Port Royal, which was a notorious home to pirates. Kingston is the largest English-speaking city in the Caribbean. The island's highest point is Blue Mountain Peak at 7,402 feet, which is also one of the highest mountains in the Caribbean. Jamaican Flag



The flag of Jamaica was adopted on Jamaican Independence Day, August 6th 1962, when Jamaica gained independence from the British 'Federation of the West Indies'. The design is a gold diagonal cross which splits the flag into four sections: the top and bottom sections are green representing vegetation, the right and left sections are black representing strength, and the gold represents the shining sun.
