Geography

Iceland is in the Atlantic Ocean, just below the Arctic Circle. The island was formed eighteen million years ago when a volcano erupted.

There is still a hot spot called 'The Iceland Plume'. Iceland still experiences volcanic eruptions every four to five years. Most of Iceland is covered by artic

wasteland, only 23% of the country is vegetation.

The first people to settle in Iceland were probably Irish monks who came in the 8th century. However, in the 9th century, they were driven out by Vikings. According to tradition, the first Viking to discover Iceland was a man named Naddoddur who got lost while on his way to the Faroe Islands in about 860.
