- I can pick out some details when I hear spoken French.
- I know numbers to 31(or beyond!)
- I can write some familiar words from memory.
- I can say most common phonemes I have come across so far.
- I understand how familiar adjectives are used in French.
- I can use the verb form il y a
- I can use a bilingual dictionary to check spellings and look up new words.
