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

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- Phonics is taught daily.
- Your child will be regularly and informally assessed.
- Interventions and catch up programmes will take place, where necessary

### Split into 6 phases and consist of:

- learn phoneme (sound) to grapheme (letter) correspondence
- learn diagraphs (two letters, one sound) and trigraphs (3 letters, one sound)
- alternative spelling and pronunciation for graphemes
- tricky words/Common exception words

### Phonics screening

- Taken by all Year 1s in June.
- Combination of real words and psuedo/alien words.







- It is essential that children bring their reading books to school each day. The Class Teacher/TA will listen to your child read once a week.
- Guided reading small groups will start when your child is ready.
- Children will also have the opportunity to change their individual reading books. Their books will be changed on a Tuesday and new books to be given on a Wednesday. (This week books will go home on Friday)
- They will also have a library book.
- Please support your child by encouraging them to read on a daily basis, for a minimum of 10 minutes, and signing their Reading Record when they have completed reading their books.







# <u>Maths</u>



- Maths is daily, currently in short burst lessons.
- Maths knowledge is developed over time through small steps. Lessons are practical, using lots of different equipment to build up fluency.
- Children are encouraged to build upon their existing knowledge by engaging in input sessions and visiting the maths stations in provision time.
- We use a range of different equipment and resources to support your child's maths development.
- Counting at home whenever possible is a great way to boost your child's basic number skills.







# PE and Games



If your child has PE on a Tuesday, they should come to school that day in their outdoor kit. You will be notified when your child has outdoor PE.

### Indoor PE

- Please ensure your child has the correct PE kit.
- All kit should be clearly named. Kits will be kept in school at all times and will be sent home at the end of each half term.

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## What to bring to school?



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
- Please make sure book bags, reading books, reading diaries and indoor PE kits are in school everyday (PE kits can be left in school and sent home at the end of half term).
- Reading Records Please sign the diary after listening to your child read, whether this a school book or an alternative book. Diaries will be checked once a week in school.
- Please make sure all items/clothing are labelled (including PE kits, trainers, shoes, water bottles, etc).
- Healthy playtime snacks will be provided by school where possible. You may choose to bring one from home.
- Water in bottles, please no juice.
- No toys allowed in school
- Unfortunately, we can not go through bags each day so if there is something really important to be handed in, please do so through the office.
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- Information will be sent home via e-mail, texts, Class Dojo and/or letter. Dojo's may be answered between the hours of 8am-5pm or at a convenient time during the school day.
- If you want to speak to your child's Class Teacher personally or need to discuss a matter at length then please phone school or Dojo the class teacher to arrange an appointment.
- If you would like to request time off for your child during term time, you must seek permission from Ms Loynes. Request forms can be found in the office.
