## Oral Health

- Focus on oral health throughout the year
- Visit from Anne Jepson
- Encourage links from home sending in pictures of tooth brushing and visits to the dentist
- Not allowed to bring sweets into school. Instead, encouraged to donate an unwanted or new book to school with a message from your child.



## **Observations**


