## **Key Facts**

- The Stockport Viaduct was built in 1840 for people to travel from Manchester to London. It was one of the largest brick structures in the world — made from over 11 million bricks.
- Stockport became famous for hat-making in the Victorian era.
  Many people worked in factories, but conditions were tough.
- World War 2 changed life in Stockport. Children were evacuated, people used air-raid shelters, and food was rationed.
- In 1967, a train crash in Stockport killed 49 people. This led to better railway safety and emergency services.
- Stockport keeps transforming. New roads and shops arrived in the 70s and 90s, and today, the area surrounding the viaduct is being regenerated.
